



Twentieth Century South West Regional Group Data Privacy Policy

This privacy notice tells you what to expect when the Twentieth Century Society South West (C20SW) Regional Group collects information. It applies to information that we collect about:

- Members of the Twentieth Century Society and non-members in the SW region;
- Attendees at events organised regionally through the C20SW group;
- Visitors to the C20SW website and those who subscribe to our ebulletin.

The C20SW group only holds personal data in order to enable it to fulfil its aims and objectives. This document should be read in conjunction with the Data Privacy Policy held by the Twentieth Century Society (available at: <https://c20society.org.uk/privacy-policy/>). As a member you are covered by this policy and, although we encourage you to read the below, this document applies particularly to non-members who have provided their personal information to the C20SW group.

The aims and objectives of the Twentieth Century Society are:

The Twentieth Century Society exists to safeguard the heritage of architecture and design in Britain from 1914 onwards. One of the Society's prime objectives is education, with education comes appreciation. With conservation, another prime objective, comes the continued opportunity for extending our knowledge about those buildings or artefacts, whether important or humble, rare or commonplace as the red telephone kiosk, that characterise the Twentieth Century in Britain.

C20 members, and non-members in the South West

We collect and hold basic information about C20 members, and non-members who express an interest in our activities, (e.g. names, email addresses, telephone numbers) in order to be able to contact you about events and to send you information of interest relating to the aims and objectives of the Twentieth Century Society, as set out above. We store the information on a simple database which is held securely on one of our computers, with access limited to our Secretary, who only allows use of the data for appropriate purposes aligned with the Group's objectives.

Website and Social Media

We use our website (www.c20sw.co.uk), social media (Facebook and Twitter) and our ebulletin (created using MailChimp) to provide information and raise awareness of matters related to our objectives. We do not make any attempt to determine the identities of people visiting our website or social media sites where the identities are not already apparent. Any use of analytic tools to examine the website, social media or the ebulletin is purely for use by the Committee, to ensure that we are using the best possible means of communication. You should also read the Data Protection Policies for any social media platforms you use.

Enquiries

If you email us or contact us through social media the message will be held on our systems, but we do not share that information unless there is a valid reason in line with our objectives to forward your message to other relevant parties, in which case we would seek your consent.

Conferences and Events

Any personal information that is received from people applying to attend conferences and events organised by the C20SW group is held on secure files. Where individuals have consented, the information may be used to notify attendees of subsequent events that might be of interest to them.

Right to Object to Processing of Personal Data

You have the right to object to the C20SW group processing your personal data, for example for direct marketing purposes. If you wish to object please contact as directly and we will deal with your request.
